MEMBER PROFILE: JUDITH (JUDY) HUNOLD

I was born in Geelong Victoria. When I was 11 years old I was taken to Melbourne in the care of Melbourne Legacy. I stayed in two hostels, Holmbush and Stanhope, and had wonderful care by Legacy. I shall be forever grateful for their caring and supervision otherwise I might have been a street kid!

I attended Camberwell High School then spent two years at Emily McPherson College where I did a 2 year pre-nursing course. I really loved this college and tried hard and excelled. To get to "Emily Mc" my friend and I caught a tram to the city and then wandered up to school. It was an exciting time to be in Melbourne as Melbourne had the 1956 Olympic Games. We saw many people from different countries and therefore managed to get some autographs and photos.

After this I commenced a three year nursing course at The Royal Melbourne Hospital School of Nursing. Apart from the RMH I also had experience at The Royal Children's Hospital and Fairfield Infectious Disease Hospital. At the time of some people being in iron lungs due to suffering from polio.

Time went by and I did enjoy the very disciplined training days. After some years I was married to my first husband Noel Manathunga, who was a Sri Lankan. He was an architect. Sadly I lost Noel from Motor Neurone Disease. When he died we had two sons, Ranjit who was 5 years old, and Nimal, 3 years old.

We had gone to Sri Lanka for a year seeking help for Noel as little was known about MND. We stayed with the family and despite the medical problems we managed to enjoy the good food and some of the cultural activities. I had help as the boys were only 3 years and 6 months. Whilst in Sri Lanka there was some trouble with insurgents and it was overwhelming to see the Australian shores again.

Years went by and I kept myself busy looking after the boys, some nursing and playing squash etc.

Once again time passed and after 10 years I met Bill, a professional firefighter and we married. We have been married for 40 years in April. We have 2 sons, 3 grandsons, 1 great grand son, and 2 great grand daughters.
