Message from the President.

The talk on cyber and general security from Ben Harm from the QPS last month was very timely. In a recent news article it was reported that over \$92 million had been scammed from Australians in the past year. The saddest case was one, where a family member had lost the entire life savings of \$1.2 million of a parent with dementia, in a bank scam, in spite of warnings from the parent's bank that the internet bank does not usually offer rates that good, before the transfer. We all need to be very careful indeed.

When considering problems as we age, isolation in older adults is a pervasive and often overlooked issue that affects millions of older adults worldwide. As people age, various life changes and challenges can lead to increased isolation and loneliness. Isolation not only diminishes the quality of life for seniors but also poses serious health risks, including depression, anxiety, cognitive decline, and even increased mortality rates.

The reasons behind isolation in older adults are multifaceted, ranging from the loss of loved ones to physical and mental health issues, financial constraints, and technological barriers. Recognising these factors is crucial in developing effective strategies to mitigate isolation and improve the overall well-being of older adults.

Branch Refund Policy

Cancellation of an outing

The branch policy for late cancellations. Notify the Secretary or Treasurer 48 hours beforehand. A Medical Certificate will be required to receive a refund if notification is 24 hours or less. In the case of a <u>sudden</u> medical emergency on the day which cannot be prevented, the Management Committee will consider the matter with respect to a refund
