NSA News: Money remains on the move......

Armaguard bail -out ensures cash movement between banks, supermarkets and ATM's An agreement sealed this week between for Armaguard to continue moving money around the country is good news for the economy –and for NSA's Keep The Cash campaign. Armaguard has reportedly accepted a bail-out worth \$50 Mill. from 8 customers, including majors banks and supermarkets. The money will allow it to continue operating for the 12 month beginning 1st July.

Part of the Linfax group, Armaguard moves money between businesses, including the big retailers, and the banks. It also operates a chain of automatic teller machines under the atmx brand.

Despite controlling 90% of cash movement around Australia since it's merger last year with it's main competitor Prosegur, Armaguard has been struggling due to the declining use of cash and, therefore, demand for it's services. Cash purchases in Australia have fallen from more the 60% of transactions in 2010 to 13% in 2022' and from 2018 to 2022, the value of transactions using digital wallets rather than cash increased from 750Mill to \$93 Billion. Under the deal, Commonwealth Bank, ANZ, Westpac, NAB, Coles, Woolworth, Bunnings, and Australia Post will make monthly payments in return for Armaguard meeting efficiency and restructuring requirements.

An independent accountant will ensure Armaguard meets it's target.

The news will be welcomed by the thousands of Australians who have expressed their wish to continue using banknotes and coins in the face of relentless move towards a "Cashless Economy". According to a Reserve Bank survey, one in four Australians say they would experience genuine hardship or major inconvenience if they could not access cash.

Many older Australians have expressed a preference for cash to conduct certain transactions, as have people in regional and remote areas where internet services can be patchy or non-existent.

NSA has been at the forefront for the movement to give people a choice in the way they make payments through the "Keep Cash" campaign.
