REPORT ON OUR CAIRNS TO CAPE YORK ADVENTURE

Branch members left a cold Greensborough very early on a Friday and flew to Cairns, a lovely warm 25 degrees.

The next day we began our 7-day Cape York drive with Heritage Tours. Our Driver/Tour Guide, Daryll, was excellent and we began to experience and appreciate the remote areas of the Outback.

There were lots of highlights:

- * Cooktown with all the history of Captain Cook and his involvement with the Indigenous Tribes with a balanced view from both sides.
- * Weipa a large mining town which exports thousands of tons of Bauxite to China.
- * Bramwell Station a TrueBlue Aussie Cattle Station with interesting accommodation and an amazing Singer/Poet/very funny joke teller providing nighttime entertainment.
- * Fruit Bat Falls where at last we could enjoy a swim No Crocodiles.
- * At Cape York we stood at the very Tip of Mainland Australia.
- * Somerset one of the Greatest Historical places in Australia being the Earliest permanent white settlement on the Cape York Peninsula area, the most isolated and violent place in Australia.
- * Ferry to Thursday Island once home to the Romantic Pearl Lugger fleet, where some of us had lunch & a drink at the most Northern Hotel in Australia. Then a ferry to Horn Island & our flight back to Cairns.
- * We all enjoyed a Kuranda Scenic Rainforest Train & Sky Rail Cableway & a walk around the Kuranda Market. Very interesting.
- * Free day in Cairns for a Well-Earned Rest or Tours to Green Island & Great Barrier Reef.

A wonderful adventure enjoyed by all, but we now sorely miss the 27 degrees.
