NSA REPORT on PREVENTABLE HOSPITALISATION.

People aged 65 years and over accounted for almost half (46 per cent) of all potentially preventable hospitalisations, and children (aged 0–14) made up 13 per cent (1 in 8).

The likelihood of having a preventable hospitalisation varies by where you live and your individual circumstances, according to a new report from the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (AIHW).

Potentially preventable hospitalisations are admissions to hospital that could have been avoided through prior treatment in the community.

This includes preventive care such as vaccination, or appropriate disease management, including treatment of infections or management of chronic conditions.

Older people, especially, need to pay attention to their health and medical needs.

The most common cause (10%) of potentially preventable hospitalisations was chronic obstructive pulmonary disease.

Vaccine-preventable pneumonia and influenza, and congestive cardiac failure accounted for the most days of hospital care.

Preventable hospitalisations increase with remoteness and socioeconomic disadvantage.
