Branch Meeting - Thurs June 13th

As an introductory, pre-morning tea item, your editor presented a show and tell travelogue on his, and Marion's, April trip to Morocco, which appeared to be well received by the 82 member audience.

This was a memorable trip in an exciting, but peaceable country with friendly people

The principal guest speaker was Henry Chambers, an exercise physiologist with the UWA Exercise Performance Centre, who spoke on the benefit of aquatic activities in countering the effects of ageing in seniors. Subjects covered were: bone density relating to osteoporosis; loss of muscle mass caused by insufficient exercise; Principal Adaption to Imposed Demand (SAID); improvement in body awareness and balance in the pool; cardiovascular improvement from repetition workload on the heart etc.

He recommended 150-300 serious exercise minutes per week in 5 days as a minimum. The audience was invited to participate in chair yoga type exercises – which most attempted. Overall, a very good presenter.
